

Urgent Maternal Warning Signs

If you have any of these symptoms during or after pregnancy, contact your health care provider and get help right away:

- Headache that won't go away
- Dizziness or fainting
- Thoughts about hurting yourself or your baby
- Changes in your vision
- Fever
- Trouble breathing
- Chest pain or fast heartbeat
- Severe belly pain that doesn't go away
- Severe nausea and throwing up (not like morning sickness)
- Baby's movements stopping or slowing
- Vaginal bleeding or fluid leaking during pregnancy
- Vaginal bleeding or fluid leaking after pregnancy
- Swelling, redness, or pain in your leg
- Extreme swelling of your hands or face
- Overwhelming tiredness
